INTRODUCTION

"Futsal" started on the 8th of September of 1930 when Juan Carlos Ceriani, a teacher in Montevideo (Uruguay) created a version of indoor football for recreation in YMCAs. This new sport was originally developed for playing on basketball courts, and a rule book was published in September 1933. Ceriani's goal was to create a team game that could be played indoor or outdoor but that was similar to football. Ceriani, writing the rule book, took as examples the principles of football (the possibility to touch the ball with every part of the body except for the hands), and he took rules from other sports too: from basketball the number of team players (five) and the game duration (40 actual minutes); from waterpolo the rules about the goalkeeper; from handball for the field and goal sizes. Futsal, fútbol sala and futebol de salão will be covered on this project. Most of the images on this timeline has been hyperlinked to the original source of information. Click on them to learn more about those events.

The objective of this research has been **three-fold: a**) to recognise and acknowledge the people that got involved and helped in this process; **b**) to document the history and the steps of development that futsal took in England and **c**) to know the history, to understand the present and improve the future (very similar to Carl Sagan's quote).

Of course, when this type of studies are carried out, there is the risk to miss out information or key point. We apologise in advance if that has happened. It was not our intention. We would like to encourage anyone that has more information to help us to fill in some of the gaps or to send us documents that prove some key point of the futsal history in England.

A squad of some of the area's best indoor footballers was quickly assembled and with sponsors in place the team flew to the other side of the world where they produced some remarkable upset victories over well established futsal nations. England finished 12th out of 16 countries.



Expanding the Sport

Geoff Payton, who is still the 1st FIFA Futsal World Cup administrator of the league, was contacted by Mark Potter from Perth (Scotland) regarding taking the game north of the border. Once again a squad of players was assembled and the game of futsal was spread to another country where a well organised league now exists.

Pendle Futsal League

Geoff had lived and played in Australia for several years. League continued until 2002. The league has sent representative teams compete all over the world. It has also hosted tournaments with teams from Gibraltar. Australia and Canada.

Simon Clifford borrowed £5000 from a teachers' union to fund a trip to Brazil, where he spoke with Zico and Ri velino, and watched them

In May, a team participated in the Genk International Futsal Tournament (Belgium). John Warnock, received the invitation and Mark Potter took a team combining English and Scottish players.

First leagues commenced in 2001 after initial refusal of rules by Lincolnshire FA. Kevin made a phone call to FIFA. FIFA were supportive from day one. At this time England and Germany were the only major countries outside the FIFA world futsal fraternity. For the next two years FIFA Futsal emails came to Kevin at Grimsby and not FA Headquarters. Kevin founded the Grimsby Futsal League in 2002.

British Ladies Squad

Geoff Payton took a British Futsal Ladies Squad in January 1996 to Australia to compete in an international tournament.



Brazilian Soccer School UK Confederation of Futebol de Salão

After returning from Brazil Simon Clifford founded Brazilian Soccer School in Leeds and the UK Confederation of Futebol de Salão. His business got expanded worldwide and became a very successful company.

Kevin Bryant

The Grange Community Centre Grimsby had dwindled down to the last £80 in its football budget. Kevin was asked, 'Could he put the money to good coaching use?' He booked 4 sessions in a sports hall and introduced: Futsal. Why Futsal? After thousands of miles of travel around UK meeting South American coaches and foreign students at UK Universities Kevin knew Futsal had to be the way forward for him. First games at Western School, it started with 8 players. A video and an internet set of outdated rules were used for guidance.



British Isles Nations Futsal Cup

In February/October 2002, the first international tournament in England was held in Chester, the British Isles Nations Futsal Cup. It was hosted by Tranmere Victoria FC, with four other teams representing Ireland, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Gibraltar, Tranmere Victoria FC

won.



FIFA Meetings with The FA

FIFA set up a meeting for representatives of the small English Futsal community to meet with the FA at the Hillsborough Leisure Centre (Sheffield). Mr Victor Beceiro, FIFA Head of Futsal Development, chaired the meeting. As a result of the meeting, Sheffield & Hallam County FA set up an invitation tournament which showcased our limited futsal resources to Mr Beceiro who was making his second visit. Six male teams competed, of which three travelled from Grimsby. Three ladies teams played, one being from Iran. Tranmere Victoria FC won the tournament and as a result were later chosen by The FA to be the first team to represent England in the UEFA Futsal Cup. The result of the FIFA intervention was for the FA to set up a Futsal Development Committee. Development was slow, eventually futsal was accepted by top management at The FA and the 'Futsal Development Committee' ceased to exist. Kevin Bryant, Clive Dinsdale, John Warnock... were some members of this Committee.

Tranmere Victoria vs Iran

FIFA

Kevin Bryant received a FIFA email addressed to the European Governing bodies and 'him' offering the opportunity to play Iran (at time rated fifth in the FIFA World Rankings) who was planning a European tour ahead of the FIFA Asian Futsal Tournament. He forwarded the email to Tranmere Victoria, an amateur futsal team with a generous sponsor. Geoff Hughes was their president Iran came over and the FA attended. Iran won 20-3.



st The FA Futsal Cup

The FA introduced The FA Futsal Cup. Sheffield & Hallam were the first winners. Twelve invited teams played inaugural tournament, three teams were from Grimsby. Four referees officiated, two from Grimsby.

FA England National Team TheFA

In June, first England Futsal National Team representing The FA. Graeme Dell first England Futsal Manager. Team Kuala travelled to (Thailand) Lumpur World play KL England Tournament. (14-1),played Iran Uzbekistan (10-2) and Indonesia (3-2) losing all

the games.

Futsal Premier League

Gary Macbeth, a London based futsal supporter, Mark Potter (Scotland) and Kevin Bryant organised seasons one and two of the Futsal Premier League. This league was fore runner to FA National League. FA covered referee costs.

The league ran successfully for two seasons, part sponsored by FA, only for the FA to start its own FA National Futsal League (2008). The teams had no option but to follow the FA as they held the purse strings and UEFA entry forms was only sent to governing bodies.

First Ever Main Round

In March 2013, England played in Erzurum (Turkey) against Ukraine (7-0 lost), Turkey (4-3 lost) and Slovenia (5-2 lost) their first ever main qualification round.



A Catalyst For Change

In November 2014, The FA organised a coaching conference in SGP.



FIFA Qualification

In January, England missed the main qualification round for the 9th UEFA European Futsal Championship (Serbia 2016) just by one goal difference. However, in October they qualified for the first ever time to a main qualification round for the 8th FIFA World Futsal Cup (Colombia 2016) after beating Wales (4-2), Denmark (5-4) and Israel (3-1).

UEFA Qualification

England qualified for the first ever time to a main qualification round for the 8th UEFA European Futsal Championship (Belgium 2014) in Kaunas (Lithuania) after beating Lithuania 4-3 (25-1-2013) and Cyprus 2-1 (26-1-2013).



UEFA B Futsal

First ever UEFA B Futsal Pilot Course delivered by Ian Bateman, Pete Sturgess, Michael Skubala, Tony Elliott, Daniel Berdejo-del-Fresno, Mico Martic and Mark Birkett.



Luke Ballinger's Golden Cup

Luke Ballinger received a golden cap in front of 90,000 fans at Wembley (14th November 2017) vs Brazil. He is the first England futsal player to reach the milestone of 100 caps, which he achieved in a game in Germany last year. He has scored 60 goals and skipped the team 60 times.

FA Futsal Strategy 2018-24

Michael Skubala presented the new strategy. The new document, which is titled 'Fast Forward with Futsal', outlines The FA's plan to develop futsal by setting four ambitious targets to achieve by 2024 within four key strands: participation, workforce, facilities and international.

England participated in the UEFS Futsal Men's Championship celebrated in Portugal. England finished 4th behind Portugal, Czechoslovakia and Spain. England would repeat participation in 1992, but finishing 10th this time.

U19 England Futsal

England's Futsal U19s squad will play their first ever international games in March when they face the Netherlands.



U19 England Futsal Tournament

The England U19 futsal squad will head to France in August to compete in a Four Nations Tournament. Following a successful year of development, the Young Lions will travel to Montaigu and compete at the Complexe Sportif Max Bossis Arena on 28 and 29 August.





U19 England Futsal Euros

The Young Lions will face Italy on Wednesday 27 March and hosts Croatia the following day before playing Slovakia in their final match on Saturday 30 March, with all of the games taking place at the Mladost Hall in Karlovac.



National Futsal Series

In 2019 The FA launched the new league format. The National Futsal Series (NFS) is the top tier of futsal in England, the inaugural season was 19/20 which was voided due to the COVID-19 pandemic.





The FA Statement

After having an online virtual meeting with all the players and staff on the 23rd September 2020, The FA released the following statement the day after at 10am confirming the cuts and the end of the England futsal national team.

Later on the same day the players released another statement while they are preparing one collective petition for the futsal family and wider sporting community to show their strength of feeling.

Grimsby Futsal League Organiser

*Grimsby is recognised in The FA literature as a start point for English futsal. This is not 100% correct; the first league was in 1988 in Colne with the Pendle Futsal League organised by Geoff Payton (Lancashire) and Grimsby the first The FA 'affiliated' league. Santos FSC from the Pendle Futsal League played in the inaugural The FA Futsal Cup along with Tranmere Victoria. Tranmere Victoria is still competing at highest level 2020. Pendle dropped out of competitive futsal at very early stage due to the factories the players worked in having summer shut downs that clashed with major The FA competitions. Wheels fell off Grimsby in National competitions 2015 onwards due to lack of adequate local facilities and breakdown in communication from The FA to County FA and subsequently ourselves. Thankfully a situation resolved and Kevin is optimistic 2021 onwards will see Grimsby back leading and not playing catch up.


